



Accreditation The Executive MSc in Supply Chain Management is accredited by the Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport (CILT) and the Chartered Institute of Procurement and Supply (CIPS). This will ensure you gain the relevant, functional skill sets that meet the needs of the industry. On successful completion of your MSc, you are eligible to apply for full membership of both institutes, once you have completed three years of relevant work experience.

The programme offers a blend of on-campus and online learning spread over a two-year period. This dynamic format is designed to accommodate the diverse needs and schedules of working professionals, providing you with flexibility without compromising the quality of education.

There is also significant demand across industries for supply chain professionals who possess strong communication, interpersonal, and negotiation skills, combined with analytics and data science and an overall strategic understanding of business.

Modules have been designed to develop and refine these skills. A choice of electives allows the flexibility to personalise your programme to align with your career ambitions and professional needs.

Modules are assessed using a combination of written assignments, presentations, data analysis exercises and portfolios.

Strategic Supply Chain Project

The final project is where you'll tackle a real-world supply chain challenge, exploring a topic that's both crucial and relevant to your field. You'll apply advanced analytical tools and strategies from previous modules, honing your ability to solve complex problems and implement practical solutions. Since access to relevant data is crucial, it is likely you'll focus on an issue within your own organisation, making it even more impactful.

Additional research methods training will be delivered during the final visit to Durham, combined with a supply chain simulation game, case competition and Supply Chain Leadership Talk Series.

Career advancement opportunities

Executives in various functions, particularly within supply chains, are encountering significant challenges due to increased disruptions, rising customer expectations and the necessity for resilience and sustainability in their organisations.

To meet these demands, many executives must enhance their own skills and those of their teams. This programme addresses these challenges by focusing on key concepts and the latest developments that will define supply chain excellence.

Throughout the modules and especially the strategic supply chain project, participants will gain a deeper understanding of the real challenges facing their organisations and sector and the ability to explore and develop practical solutions to address those challenges, being informed by latest academic research.

Together with professional accreditations of CIPS and CILT, this programme is designed to advance your career and open up new opportunities across supply chain functions, supply chain digital transformations, sustainable supply chain management and in supply chain consultancy.

Entry requirements

- At least three years continuous postgraduation work experience in one or more positions demonstrating a high degree of responsibility.
- Upper Second Class bachelor's degree, or international equivalent
- Lack of formal qualifications is not necessarily a barrier to admission; managerial experience is also a key consideration for entry to the Part-Time Executive MSc in Supply Chain Management. If you don't have an Upper Second Class bachelor's degree, you will be required to submit a portfolio of evidence demonstrating capability in areas such as management experience, including critical thinking skills and communication skills.

Language requirements

Additionally, candidates whose first language is not English will normally be required to demonstrate evidence of proficiency in English language as follows: a recent English language test score of 7.0 or above in IELTS with no element below 6.0, or 102 or above in TOEFL IBT with no element below 23 or an alternative University approved English language test.


