-THE JCR-GREY COLLEGE JCR: What is it?



Grey JCR (or Junior Common Room) is more than just the room within college. It is a charitable student-run organisations that operates within Grey college to provide a student community. Grey JCR is run by students for all the students of Grey. All of the sports and societies, events and facilities fall under the JCR. The membership fee you pay at the start of your time in Grey goes directly towards improving facilities run by the JCR, as well as the day-to-day budgets of all the sports, societies and events.

The major decision making regarding how the JCR spends its money, who gets elected to what positions, and any votes/referendums occurs during JCR meetings. These are usually 60-90 minutes long and take place every few weeks on a Sunday. They're quite chilled, where you can turn up with a laptop, have a drink and buy some snacks. They're open to all JCR members, and you don't have to have any prior experience. Getting involved couldn't be easier!

JCR FINANCES

JCR MEMBERSHIP

The JCR is a charity, independent from the university, which is run by students for the benefit of Grey college students. We have a membership fee which you can pay in order to join the JCR (over 90% of students do). Whilst membership is optional, we strongly encourage all students to join to make the most of their time at Durham.

For those starting a 3-year degree (BA/BSC...) it would cost £180 which you pay at the start of your degree programme. If you are doing a 4-year integrated master's degree, you get a reduced rate in your final year, making it £220. We appreciate that this is a lot of money, therefore the Access Fund is available see the Grey JCR Website for details.

The JCR organises most of student life in college and allows members to:

become a member of the JCR's sports, societies and committees and

participate in training/rehearsals, meetings - we are the only college to offer this with no joining fees!

compete for the JCR's sports teams in college sport
priority booking and payment of preferential members' rates to events organised by the JCR (including balls and formals)

be employed by the JCR as a member of the toastie bar or technical crew

Preferential rate of membership to the college gym.
access to JCR equipment (musical instruments, sports, tech)
vote at JCR meetings and stand for elected roles
Access the JCR-run welfare signposting service and loads more!

It's a great place to socialise and hang out with friends - you'll almost always find someone you know. All of the friendly bar staff are also fellow Grey students, anyone can apply to work here!







The gym at college has 3 rooms, containing cardio and weights machines. Looked after by the gym managers, you can buy membership on a termly or yearly basis.

The dining hall is one of the best places to catch up with friends over some elite scran. Breakfast, lunch and dinner are all served here for a couple of hours per day, with brunch on weekends. Be warned, it is cordial (you'll find out soon enough)

> A dream for some, a nightmare for others, but whatever you choose, the library is a key room in college. With computers and a printer, and loads of study spaces, its perfect for some quiet time. There are also books, available when a student librarian is around.

Fountains Hall is Grey's own multi-use building. It has a chapel, media suite, music practice rooms and a larger hall space. Rooms can be booked for free and used for sports, rehearsals and lots more.

<u>Winter Ball</u>

The big event in first term. Previous themes have included 'Masquerade' and 'A Night Under the Stars'. This includes a 3-course meal and a huge range of entertainment afterwards - such as fairground rides, inflatables, arcade games, candy floss, popcorn machines and more.

Barfest

Run by the Bar Committee in second term, this is a day of chilling in college with a huge variety of drinks and entertainment. There is also cheese and wine tasting, not one to be missed...

Grey Charity Fashion Show

Widely recognised as one of the most professional student fashion shows in Durham, this is a great night of strutting the catwalk all in aid of charitable causes. Previous themes included 'Inferno' and 'A Night in Hollywood'.

<u>Grey Unplugged</u>

A showcase of all the musical talent that Grey has to offer, with many student bands putting on a performance.

Gittins Cup

International Reps



-THE MCR-

Hello! My name is Fiona, and I am the Chaplain of the Hill Colleges.


I am here to listen to chat for cups of tea for biscuits for when things are going well, and for if things could be better.

Science Site



The home of those strange students who do science degrees. Located a handy 5 minute walk from Grey, so it's easy to roll out of bed at 8:55 for a 9am lecture. You can also find lots of study spaces, including the Bill Bryson (Billy B) library and the Teaching and learning centre (TLC)

<u>Elvet Riverside</u> Not to be confused with the Elvet block at Grey this place hosts the humanities students. A risky walk down a very busy path, allow a good 15 minutes to get here.



Student Union



A curious looking building, designed by the architect of the Sydney Opera House, the SU has a great bar and roof terrace for summer. It's also the home of Grey Boat Club. Anyone who says they don't like it is wrong...

<u>Maiden Castle(Graham Sports Centre)</u> Team Durham's sports complex. It hosts many pitches including crumb and water-based pitches. There's also netball, tennis and squash courts, indoor sports halls and a fencing gallery! Bit of a trek if you like sports.



Cathedral


<u>Clubs</u>

The last train to Durham leaves at 22:55(although this can change so check before you go!), so if you're there for the night you'll need to get the bus back, or wait for the first morning train, normally at about 04:30.

Night buses(the N21) run on Friday and Saturday nights, leaving from the Monument Market Street, Monument Grainger Street or High Level Bridge North End stops.
