




## ~ Map of Grey ~

## ~ Durham Dictionary ~

There are lots of new words you might see and hear during your time at Durham - here we've defined a few of them!

Billy B:

Bill Bryson Library, the University's main library. A very popular location for studying as well as being somewhere you can borrow books

BNOC:

Stands for Big Name On Campus, usually describes someone who seems to know lots of people/is quite well known around Durham

Formals:

A fancy dinner in the dining hall where you get to dress up and wear your gown - and there's usually entertainment afterwards too!

Welcome and Orientation Week:

The official Durham Name for Freshers' Week (also called Welcome Week or WOW), your first week at university.

Frep:

A shortened version of Fresher Representative, these are the people in pink polos who you'll see a lot during Freshers' Week. There's a whole section about them on pages 25-27, so check out those pages for more info

**Durfess:** 

A Facebook page that posts people's anonymous confessions. Another similar Facebook page is Tindur.

The Greyhound:

Grey's college bar, you'll often find it busy on an evening as people go to get drinks with friends. It will also host various events during Freshers' Week, and it should be open every night too!

FACSO:

**Financial And Commercial Services Officer** 

Cardiac Hill:

A steep path connecting the science site (near the CLC) and Upper Mountjoy (near the Biosciences building). If you think you've walked up some steep hills in Durham, just wait until you have to walk up Cardiac Hill.

Stash:

The college or university branded clothes/items. You'll probably see hundreds of students walking around in their college branded puffer jackets. Sarah (our JCR secretary) is in charge of this, so keep an eye out for an email from her.

Jimmy's:

Jimmy Allens, one of the most popular clubs in Durham.

**Bailey Colleges:** 

Refers to the colleges in town, on 'The Bailey', e.g. St Cuthbert's Society, St Chad's, St John's etc.

Hill Colleges:

Refers to the colleges on South Road, e.g. Grey, John Snow, Josephine Butler, Trevelyan, St Mary's etc.

**Matriculation:** 

Your formal acceptance into the university. It's held in the Cathedral and should be happening on the Wednesday of Freshers' Week.

Michaelmas, Epiphany, and Easter:

The names of the three terms at Durham, in the order that they occur.

Hust:

A short speech that someone gives when they are running for a role in the JCR, or a sport or society.

Big Tesco:

Tesco is a supermarket, and Big Tesco is just a big supermarket that's located in Gilesgate.

**Angels:** 

Angels by Robbie Williams is a song you'll probably hear a lot during your time at Durham; it's a favourite to be played at the end of a club night.


**Senior Team:**

## ~ What is a JCR? ~


Grey JCR (Junior Common Room) is a student-run charity that exists to create the best possible student experience within Grey. It runs sports, societies, all kinds of events, freshers' week, and so much more. With over 900 paid members at Grey, it is independent to the University, meaning every decision it makes is only for the benefit of students. The membership you can buy at the start of your time in Grey goes directly towards improving facilities run by the JCR, the day-to-day budgets of sports, societies, and events, on top of the general upkeep a charity of this scale needs.

Being a member has a host of benefits, such as free tickets for events, discounted balls, and free participation in sports and societies. The major decision-making regarding how the JCR spends its money, who gets elected to what positions (there are over 50!), and any votes or referendums occur during JCR meetings. These take place every few weeks on a Sunday. They're quite chilled, where you can turn up with a laptop, have a drink and buy some snacks. Open to all JCR members, you don't have to have any prior experience or knowledge with how the JCR operates. Getting involved couldn't be easier! You can find more information at greyjcr.co.uk, or by speaking to anyone in a pink or blue polo in Freshers' week!

# ~ JCR Finances ~

## JCR Levy

The JCR is a charity, independent from both college and the university, which is run by Grey students for the benefit of Grey students. We have a membership fee which you can pay in order to join the JCR (over 90% of students in college do!) and participate in all of our extra-curricular events and activities for reduced prices or even for free!

For a 3-year Undergraduate degree (BA/BSc...) it costs £195, which is paid at the start of your degree programme. If you are doing a 4-year Integrated Master's degree, you get a discounted rate in your final year, making it £235. We appreciate that this is a lot of money to spend at once, so the Access Fund is available – see below for details.

# THE JCR ORGANISES MOST OF STUDENT LIFE IN COLLEGE AND ALLOWS MEMBERS TO:

- Become a member of the JCR's sports, societies and committees and participate in trainings/rehearsals/meetings we are the only college in Durham to offer this without having to pay separate joining fees!
- Compete for the JCR's sports teams in the college sports leagues.
- Access priority booking and payment of reduced members' rates to events organised by the JCR (including Balls, Formals and Grey Day)
- Be employed by the JCR as a member of Grey Pantry or the Technical Crew
- Get a reduced rate on membership to the college gym.
- Access and hire JCR equipment (musical instruments, sports kit, tech)
- Vote at JCR meetings and stand for roles within the JCR
- Access the JCR-run Welfare signposting service

## ~ Welcome Week ~

Our JCR-run welcome week has many events that are organised throughout Freshers, including club nights, inflatables, a petting zoo and more!

The JCR membership and Welcome Week package are recommended to be purchased in advance of arriving at Grey (details will be in the College Handbook or Vice Principal's letter) but can also be purchased on move-in day.

At Grey we aim to have everyone participate in our activities, but if you have any difficulty with paying any fees, the Access Fund is available and may be of assistance – see the next page for details.



# The Access Fund and Grey College Financial Support

The JCR wants to ensure that no student is held back from participating in college life or the common room due to financial barriers. We understand that the costs of living in Durham and being at university can add significant financial pressure, sometimes limiting options for equal access for members and prospective members.

#### **ACCESS FUND**

Within the JCR, we offer the Access Fund, that any member or prospective member is welcome to apply for. The Access Fund provides support in the form reducing immediate upfront costs, offering the option to pay in instalments, partially waive fees, or fully waive fees depending on your financial situation. The Access Fund can be used for the JCR membership fee, events tickets, gym memberships and participating in JCR sports and societies.

Applications are considered confidentially by the Access Fund Sub-Committee of the JCR's Board of Trustees. To apply for it, you will need to provide supporting evidence to show your situation. #### **GREY COLLEGE SUPPORT**

As well as the JCR financial support, Grey College also offers financial assistance for individuals for cultural activities, sporting activities, intellectual development, employability development, degree-related travel opportunities, and research-based opportunities in the form of Grey College Trust Awards through donations and endowments from generous Grey College alumni. #### The Greyhound Bar

It's a great place to socialise and hang out with friends -

#### What is Welfare?

At Grey College, our Welfare team is dedicated to supporting every student throughout the year. During Freshers' Week, they can be easily spotted in their blue polos during the day, at the clubs, and giving tea and biscuits out at night. Coming to university can often lead to a range of emotions, and our welfare team is here to listen to you about anything, big or small. Our team offers a non-judgmental, confidential, and compassionate listening and signposting service available to you throughout the year, not just Fresher's Week!

#### How do I get in touch?

Our welfare team hold drop-in sessions 3 times a week: Tuesday and Thursday 18:30-20:30 and Sunday 14:00-16:00 in the bottom floor of Hollingside and on Teams. Outside of drop-in times, you can contact our Senior Welfare Officers through our anonymous messaging service on the JCR Website (greyjcr.co.uk), where we aim to reply within a few days.

#### What is chaplaincy support?

I'm here to help support all students and staff with their emotional and spiritual wellbeing whatever a person's faith, belief, or worldview. This means:

- <u>I'm here to listen</u> we can talk about the ups and downs of life; grief; worries; problems with friendships... anything else on your heart and mind.
- Community building I lead wellbeing activities and community events which bring people together like tea parties and carol services. #### **Science Site**

#### **Riverview Cafe**

A beautiful setting that is great for brunch, coffee, cake and more. Go with friends and family alike. Their pancakes are particularly impressive!

#### **Chapters Cafe**

One of the tastiest hot chocolates in Durham, it's also a great place to meet friends for a catch up and chat.





#### La Spaghettata

A student favourite due to their tasty food, cheap wine and free garlic bread!



Great burgers with loads of veggie and vegan options too! Sometimes you'll get lucky and find their van on the science site...





#### **Lebaneat**

A great restaurant to hold socials in, with wraps, kebabs, chips, and only a small corkage fee to take in whatever drink you want!

#### **Paddys**

En route back to college from town makes it a great pit stop. Cheesy chips on top here.

#### The Swan and Three Cygnets

Located on Elvet Riverside, perfect for spotting any passing rowers. A Sam Smith pub – put your phone away!





#### **Bishops Mill Wetherpoons**

Head down to Walkergate for a classic spoons evening. Cheap pints and occasionally some bingo. Sometimes transforms into the legendary disco Spoons.

#### The Boat Club

Another perfect river watching spot. Keep your eyes peeled for the 2for-1 deals and maybe stay away from the boats for hire when day drinking.





#### The Library Bar

Not many books can be found here. Tasty cocktails and located on The Bailey, so perfect for a stop on the way to Jimmys.

#### Jimmy Allens

Definitely Durham's favourite place to be on any night of the week. Walk in here and you'll always find a fellow Grey student.





#### Babylon/Loft

A slightly further walk from Grey but worth it. Home of sports socials on Wednesdays and busy dancefloors.

#### Fabio's Bar

Come for the cheap cocktails, stay for the (sometimes) live music. Located above spags, their LGBTQ+ Thursdays are popular!





#### **Klute**

Popular on a Sunday night, legend has it that Klute has been around over 40 years. Famously the second worst club in Europe, until the worst burnt down!

## ~ Newcastle ~

If you decide you fancy the venture further north, trains to Newcastle take 15 minutes and cost as little as £5. There are also buses that go from Durham Bus Station to Newcastle which are cheaper but involved a longer journey.

## Things to do/places to go:

- Live music/comedy at the O2, Metro Radio Arena, NX Newcastle, Utility Arena and many more
- Shopping in Grainger Market
- Visit an art gallery
- Go ice skating
- Play mini golf
- Sing karaoke
- Take the Metro to the seaside

And the list goes on!

#### **Getting There**

During the day, there are regular trains to Newcastle, taking only 15 minutes. There are also regular buses, but these tend to take closer to an hour.

The last train to Durham leaves at 22:55 (although this can change so check before you go!), so if you're there for the night you'll need to get the bus back, or wait for the first morning train, normally at about 04:30.

Night buses (the N21) run on Friday and Saturday nights, leaving from the Monument Market Street, Monument Grainger Street or High Level Bridge North End stops.




#### Clubs:

There are loads of clubs in Newcastle, so here are a few:

- Soho rooms a popular four storey club
- Tup Tup Palace hip hop and R&B
- Howlers has a ball pit and karaoke
- TheCUT indie music
- Popworld pop classics

## ~ The North East ~

There is so much more to see and do around Durham than just Newcastle! Here are a few of our favourites...



#### Beamish Museum

Beamish is a unique museum that allows you to become fully immersed in the story of the people of North East England in the 1820s, 1900s, and 1940s. You can taste traditional food from a coal-fired range, go on a tram or steam train, play schoolyard games, or even pop into the Co-op shops. You can also visit as many times as you want in a year when you buy your ticket!

#### **Seaham**

One (of many) great thing about Durham is how close it is to the coast. There are dozens of beaches that are relatively easy to get to by public transport, including Seaham which is accessible by bus from Durham Bus Station. Known for its sea glass, Seaham is a lovely pebble beach with plenty of cafes around to go to grab something to eat or drink.



#### **Alnwick Castle**

Alnwick Castle has quite the history - from battles and rebellions to tradgey and romance. You might recognise it from the Harry Potter films or even Downton Abbey as both have scenes filmed here. There's all sorts to do at Alnwick Castle, including guided tours, medieval crafts, and broomstick lessons.



High Force is a gorgeous waterfall in Upper Teesdale which cascades 21 metres into the plunge pool beneath it. The Pennine Way footpath leads through pretty woodlands and takes you past both High Force and Low Force falls.





#### **Bishop Auckland**

Easily accessible from Durham city centre by bus, Bishop Auckland is a historic market town known for its stunning castle, rich heritage, and vibrant arts scene. There's even an annual food festival held in the castle grounds every April.

#### National Glass Centre

The National Glass Centre is located at the University of Sunderland and showcases Sunderland's glass making heritage as well as celebrating the work of contemporary artists working at the cutting edge of their field. It has an interactive exhibition which covers the history of glass making in the city from the 7th Century to the present day.



# ~ Frequently Asked Questions ~

Here are come Frequently Asked Questions that you may have before coming to Durham and to Grey, including some questions our livers-out students may have about getting involved in university/college life:

How can I stay involved in university life while living off-campus?

Joining societies, sports, clubs, or volunteering opportunities are a brilliant way of meeting people outside of your flat/house - they're also open to everyone. Grey has free college sports and societies for all JCR members so it's also free to get involved and meet new people!

Are there any perks or events just for livers-out students?

Yes! Keep an eye on emails and SU social media - there are meetups, socials, giveaways, and more, especially designated to help livers-out students feel included.

I feel disconnected living far from campus. What can I do?

You are not alone! Try creating a routine that includes time on campus, message group chats to find people to walk or bus in with, and don't hesitate to reach out to our Livers Out Rep or Welfare if you want someone to talk to.

What's the best way to make friends if I don't live in student halls (or if I want to meet people outside of my corridor/flat)?

Attending events for livers-out students, chatting with classmates, and hanging out in common university spaces like the library or SU building can be a great way of meeting people. Also, everyone at Grey is invited to all of our Freshers' Week events/activities so this is also a brilliant opportunity to make friends.

Who do I talk to if I'm struggling or just need support?

You can always reach out to your Student Rep, the SU, the university Wellbeing Service, or our Welfare team if you need support. Welfare regularly run drop-ins (both online and in-person) for any Grey student if they need it.
