The Durham Miners Gala

The Durham Miners Gala also known as the Big Meeting Miners Gala is a huge event attracting many thousands of people. This tradition is stronger than ever despite this year marking the 30th anniversary of the closure of the last pits in the Durham Coalfield. The event starts at about 8 am Banners and Colliery Bands parade through town passing the County Hotel on Old Elvet where each band stops to play their "party piece" to the dignitaries on the balcony before proceeding to the Racecourse, for a rally and speeches.

The Miner's Service is held in the Cathedral at 3pm, if you want to attend the service, we recommend that you get there early to ensure getting a seat.

Museum of Archaeology - Palace Green- DH1 3RN 10am-5pm

Enjoy a new special exhibition exploring the rich prehistoric and Roman archaeology of Durham Much of Durham's history lies beneath our feet. Sometimes we can catch a glimpse of the past through the unique objects that are uncovered as the result of archaeological excavations or are unearthed by chance by members of the public. In this gallery, we explore artefacts that span 250,000 years of history - from Prehistory to the Romans The objects on display range from everyday items - such as dishes, coins, and glass bottles - to the rare and beautiful. Highlights include spectacular metalwork from the Bronze Age, Roman treasures retrieved from a murky riverbed, and the cremated remains of Durham City's earliest known resident.
