A Brief History of Trevelyan College

Trevelyan College was founded in 1966. Originally, Trevs was an all-female College in response to rising demands for residential places for women in Durham. Men first arrived at Trevs in 1992 and now, in 2023, the College is completely mixed. It was quickly recognised that Trevs' small size allowed everyone to get to know virtually everyone; as a result, we pride ourselves on being known as the friendliest College in Durham!

There have been several extensions to the original building; the Sir James Knott Hall in 1976, followed by the addition of 50 en-suite rooms (K Block) in 1991, while a tennis court was added in 1999. Trevs is now home to around 1,000 students, about 30% of whom live in. The College was named after Dr. George Macaulay Trevelyan, a famous historian, and Chancellor of the University from 1950 to 1957.

Trevs' unique hexagonal design has become a defining feature of the College. No matter where you look, there's surely a hexagonal shape somewhere, and it can be interesting trying to get from point A to point B but we love it; it reflects yet another endearing characteristic of the College. The design by architect John Eastwick-Field won the building the Civic Trust Award for "making an outstanding contribution to the surrounding scene".



The JCR

JCR stands for "Junior Common Room", and is the community of undergraduate students within Trevs. The JCR works closely with College to add to all elements of the student experience. The JCR will impact your time here at Trevs greatly, and being a member will enhance your opportunities and university experience! In short, the JCR helps make Trevs more than just student halls. The JCR provides services such as:

- Running social events, such as balls and concerts, throughout the year.
- Organising formal dinners in which all of College can come together to enjoy a meal and often a night in the bar afterwards!
- Looking after some college facilities such as the gym, table football table, and pool table.
- Providing welfare support to Trevs students.
- The Buttery (our very own fantastically stocked corner shop and toastie bar!)
- Enabling the running of societies such as sports clubs and musical groups.

All College JCRs charge a 'JCR due' or "levy" to cover the costs of these services. In Trevs, the levy is £140, and is paid once at the beginning of your time here to cover your whole time at Trevelyan (regardless of whether you are on a 3- or 4-year course). Within this Freshers' Pack, you will find details on how to pay the JCR levy and become a member which will allow you to get the most out of college life. Crucially, if you do not pay the JCR levy, you will not be able to:

- Join Trevelyan College societies and sports clubs.
- Attend JCR meetings which allow you to voice your opinions on how the JCR operates and wider university issues.
- Use the JCR sport equipment or rent out JCR camp beds.
- Apply for JCR funding to help cover costs of university life.
- Have priority access to JCR events such as Summer Ball and Trevs Night

- Apply to work at the Buttery
- Run for positions within the JCR (such as the Treasurer or Publicity Officer).
- Receive the JCR member discount on gym membership (non-members pay £160 per year, whilst members pay £50).
- Participate in JCR elections that decide your elected officers.
- Attend JCR dinners.

You will have received details of how to pay the JCR levy and other optional charges in the Freshers Pack. If you have any questions about the JCR levy, please contact Kush Pandey (JCR Treasurer) at trevelyan.treasurer@durham.ac.uk or George Little (JCR President) at trevelyan.president@durham.ac.uk. We are keen to ensure that financial pressures do not prevent incoming undergraduates from enjoying all the wonderful services on offer in the JCR. As such, should you anticipate that you will be unable to pay the full levy amount upon your arrival to Durham or have any related worries, please contact either Kush or George.



contact. They are responsible for your internet connection and the public computers (Network Service PCs). CIS also provides free technical support, website hosting, printing and a whole bundle of other services.

If you don't have your own computer, Trevs has a 24 hour computer suite with free use for any College member and nearly all libraries and

departments have their own computers available for use.

There are printers in College, the libraries, and in subject departments. Printing can be done throughout the university via your campus card, and credit can be topped up online at the link below. Printing at Durham is extraordinarily easy and more information can be found here: https://pay.durham.ac.uk/print-credit-purchase

Trevelyan's website (trevsjcr.com) is also an essential part of finding out about: daily news, welfare information, contact forms and important documents.

Campus Cards

During Welcome and Orientation Week (Freshers' Week), you'll be directed to verify your identity in one of the College offices and collect your campus card. Prior to arriving, you should have enrolled online, uploaded a photo, and if your photo has been accepted then you can collect your campus card in College. You will need to bring either a passport, driving licence, or birth certificate to verify your ID when you collect- ensure the details you enter during online enrolment match those of the physical ID. Your campus card is needed for everything in Durham; accessing other College bars, getting discounts in shops, booking out rooms or equipment in College. If lost, you will be charged for a replacement campus card.

Online Registration

Registration for modules takes place online. More information regarding this process will be available when you arrive.

Any Problems

If at any point you have issues or questions, don't hesitate to ask your Freps or contact the College Student Support Office. If they can't help you, then they can point you in the right direction of who to contact. This is a stressful time for everyone so don't panic if you're rushing to get everything done, the staff appreciate how complicated it is and tend to be lovely about it!

JCR Welfare is here to help you throughout your time at Trevs and to make sure you are safe and happy so you can make the most of your university experience! So, what does that involve?

- Drop-ins throughout the week where you can chat about anything.
- Signposting to various support services within the university and beyond.
- Providing a range of sexual health and sanitary supplies.
- Running awareness campaigns on everything from housing to mental health.
- Putting on welfare drop ins during events.

As well as a notice board near the post room, welfare has a few social media accounts. Instagram is used for posting information on events as well as advice and guidance related to our campaigns or topical issues.

WELFARE OFFICERS: Alusia Orbell (she/her) and Matthew Hall (he/him)

Hey Trevs, we are Matthew and Alysia: your co-welfare officers for 2023/24. We and the rest of the welfare team are here to support you through your time at university, helping to ensure you have the best possible experience. We can support you through a range of situations, as well as being available for a general chat. We are best found in our regular drop-ins (held in the B-ground Welfare room), but we can also be contacted by the email above. No matter the nature or level of support you seek, we can provide you with information on the relevant support services available in Durham and how to access them. Alongside this, welfare provides you with sanitary supplies and sexual health supplies that can be collected from us. This year we are aiming to increase the number of activities we put on to help boost mental health too including meditation sessions and crafting.

Alongside providing reactive support, Welfare also runs awareness campaigns covering a range of issues which are common at University: mental health, sexual health, alcohol awareness, housing etc. These campaigns are organised by the Welfare Awareness Committee which we chair. The committee is a great way for you to actively get involved with welfare, so please get in touch if you'd like to know more. Durham Disability Support

You are not alone - approximately 20% of students are currently registered with the Disability Service.

ELIGIBILITY

All students who need it, including (but not limited to) students with:

- A specific learning difficulty such as Dyslexia, Dyspraxia or ADHD.
- A condition that places you on the autistic spectrum.
- Asperger's syndrome.
- A sensory impairment.
- A physical condition affecting your mobility.
- A mental health condition.
- A long-term illness.

SUPPORT

The DDS offers a variety of professional support and advice, including:

- Advice before you arrive at Durham.
- Contact with a Disabilities Adviser upon arrival.
- Individual Student Support Plans Liaison with departments and tutors.
- Help with applying for disability related financial support.
- Referral for regular Study Skills or Mental Health support Specialist support from qualified Mental Health Advisors.
- Assistive Technology support.
- Loans of equipment, including digital voice recorders.
- Library support, including extended loans and assistive software.
- Support with examinations, such as extra time if recommended.
- One to one tuition to help develop academic reading and writing skills, effective research skills, revision techniques and exam skills.

- No volunteer will ever judge or assume your situation, regardless of what you want to talk about we're here. We're not linked with any religion/political group/other societies; you can talk to us about anything.
- It could be you're in a really difficult situation and need support, or that you're walking home alone and would rather have someone to talk to.
- We train new volunteers three times a year, so follow our social media or drop us a message for more information on volunteering with us.
- We hope your time at Durham is amazing, but there may be moments where it's a little less than that, so if you need someone to talk to, we're here.

Money Matters

JCR Finance

The JCR has 3 main sources of income:

- JCR Levy, paid by each member of the JCR in their first year. This is a £140 one off membership fee, paid to the JCR, giving you access to a huge number of incredible opportunities, such as sports teams, music & drama societies, and amazing events. Don't forget to become a member!
- The Composition Fee, a grant provided by the University.
- Income from service and investments, such as the pool table, and selling things such as event T- Shirts.

These sources of income then fund JCR facilities (such as Pool table and upper JCR), Trevs Day (an entire College day of celebrations after exams), smaller events such as bar nights, JCR clubs and societies as well as boring but important things like licensing! Currently, the JCR accepts payments through the E-commerce system for certain events and activities alongside card payments and bank transfer –Information about payments will always be circulated well in advance of any event!

eCOMMERCE System

Payments for things such as your JCR Levy, gowns, events, formals and gym membership can all be done through the University's eCommerce portal. The link above takes you to the general webpage, where you will have to sign up with a personal email or sign in with your Durham Student email once you have access to it. You will find the available options to you under:

- Individual Services > Optional College Payments
- Event Booking > Colleges and Common Rooms > Membership Subscription
- Event Booking > Colleges and Common Rooms > Event Booking

You will also receive an in depth email with specific links for all these optional charges shortly. You'll also be able to pay by card or cash - for those without UK bank accounts yet - in Freshers' week.

Where to Keep Your Money

There are quite a large number of banks in Durham so look around for the best bank for you. Look at what they are offering: some offer a 16-25 Young Persons railcard, cheap insurance or free overdrafts. Make sure you are aware of the overdraft your account has and any charges for exceeding your overdraft as well as what will happen when you graduate.

Insurance

Your personal items (laptops, phones etc.) are used at the owners own risk and the JCR bears no responsibility for loss or damage. You should check your home insurance policy to see if your personal items are covered or if you should invest in insurance to cover them. Also, Trevs JCR's insurance does not cover sporting activities, however contact Team Durham for details of what their sports insurance covers (which is part of the Team Durham fee on your first bill).

Your Personal Finance

Note that if you will be receiving a maintenance loan and/or tuition fee loan, that these are paid through Student Finance England (or equivalent), and that the Uni can't confirm your registration until you have completed University registration. All information on Uni registration will be provided once you arrive.

Finance for Freshers - Durham University

If you are worried about your finances, there is a wide range of support available to you. You should contact the Student Support Office via trevelyan.studentsupport@durham.ac.uk and schedule an appointment with the Assistant Principal who will be able to advise you on support available.

There are various other costs that you will encounter when you come to university. Many of which can be found at pay.durham.ac.uk. This list summarises some of the costs you will incur (this is not exhaustive):

- Gowns New gowns cost £57, sold at the start of Freshers' week (limited number of
 'first come-first served' second hand gowns available for £37). Gowns are required for
 Matriculation, a compulsory ceremony for induction into the University. They are also
 necessary for the majority of Trevs Formal Dinners! Gowns can be loaned for
 matriculation but be aware that they are required for multiple occasions whilst at Uni!
- JCR Levy at £140, these allow you to enjoy everything the JCR has to offer for the whole of your time as an undergraduate in Trevs. If you have any questions or concerns, don't hesitate to get in touch with the President, George Little, or the Treasurer, Kush Pandey.
- Platinum Pass (see the form in your Freshers packs for further information) for the big College bops and balls throughout the year that nearly everyone attends this costs £87 and purchasing this ticket will save you £22 in the long run!
- Gym membership Trevs has their own gym which is available for JCR and non-JCR members to use throughout the year. For JCR members, membership fee is £50. For non-JCR members, membership fee is £160. These are annual memberships that allow you access to the gym throughout the academic year and can be purchased online.
- Formals these happen about once a fortnight and start at roughly £9.00 for a full three course meal but the price can increase depending on the occasion and menu.
- Subscription Fees to Societies these vary hugely depending on the society.
- Social Life completely dependent on the individual!

Saving Tips

- Buy a Platinum Pass and save £22 later on in the year.
- Look on Amazon and charity shops for textbooks but remember to use the library!
- Your campus card acts as an NUS student card, so always ask for a student discount.
- Travel can be expensive buy your tickets in advance the coach is cheaper than the train!
- If you are going to travel by train, look into getting a 16-25 Railcard (saves a third on rail fares)
- Get involved University is one of the only chances you will get to try out new sports and activities for a fraction of the cost in the 'real world'!

Frequently Asked Questions

Something in my room is broken. How do I fix it?

We have a form for students to report room maintenance, please refer to the "Useful Information" section for the link.

How can I use the gym?

If you want to use the gym, then a gym membership is required which is £50 a year if you have paid the JCR Levy (£160 a year for non JCR members). You must also be inducted into the gym by the gym reps Angus Hong and Shameer Sheraz. Gym memberships can be purchased online at pay.durham.ac.uk under Optional College Payments. There is a rule of 2 people minimum in the gym at any time.

Can friends stay in College?

Absolutely! Friends can stay up to three days; any longer would require staff permission. Camp beds can be rented from the JCR Exec Office during drop-ins with any form of ID.

What does the JCR provide?

In addition to events, formals, and committees that you can get involved with, the JCR also has a whole room full of items you can rent out. From sports equipment to stationary supplies, the JCR will hire out plenty of items, so long as you leave a valid ID as a deposit. You can also apply to FinComm to create new societies if you think the Trevs community is missing something!

What if the College Printer runs out of ink or paper?

The JCR Office should have plenty of paper, and for new ink contact the Publicity Officer (Tennyson Godsell) in order to notify CIS.

Do I need a TV Licence?

If you decide to bring a TV with you and you want to watch BBC iPlayer or live events, then you will need a TV Licence. There are also TVs around College, and the bar will screen major live events such as football, rugby, or Eurovision.
