



General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR)

The GDPR became enforceable in the UK on 25 May 2018. You will see from the form that you need to complete that we do request a certain amount of personal data from all of our students. We only request data that is essential to allow us to support you to the fullest while you are at University. Accommodation

At Van Mildert College we do not have any shared rooms so you can be assured that you will have a room to make your own when you arrive! To reserve your College accommodation your must -

- 1. Tell us your accommodation preference by completing the Student Information Form no later than Thursday 2 September.
- 2. Read and sign the Particulars of Offer that will be sent to you via email shortly after 16 September.

Please note that if you do not sign the Particulars of Offer by the stated deadline then you will forfeit your College accommodation.

The vast majority of our new undergraduates live in College accommodation and we strongly recommend this as it ensures you can get fully involved in College life from day one. However, if you have decided that you would prefer to live elsewhere and will not require College accommodation, please ensure you let us know using the Student Information Form.

The majority of rooms for new undergraduates are standard rooms although we do have a limited number of ensuite rooms. Our standard rooms all have their own sink and shared shower and toilet facilities with neighbouring rooms. Experience suggests that the ratios of shower and toilet facilities to bedrooms work very well. If you would like to take a look at our accommodation, please have a look at our accommodation tour <u>video</u> on the College YouTube channel.

A note on ensuite rooms...while anyone is very welcome to indicate a preference for an ensuite room, we do allocate the majority of these rooms based on specific personal need. If you feel that you have a specific requirement for an ensuite room, please indicate this on the Student Information Form and supply us with appropriate evidence e.g. from a medical professional or faith leader, via email.

Welcome and Orientation

Throughout Welcome and Orientation there will be a range of activities offered by the College and the Junior Common Room (JCR). There is always a wide range of activities on offer and we feel confident that the activities being planned will ensure that there is something for everyone. From day one we want you to feel comfortable, supported and able to be yourself and this has been the foundation for our planning of Welcome and Orientation during these unprecedented times.

Full details of the activities taking place during Welcome and Orientation 2021 at Van Mildert College will be provided by email in due course and we hope that you will want to get involved and meet fellow students.

Arrival dates

All new home undergraduates should arrive at Van Mildert College on **Saturday 25 September**. Shortly after we receive your signed Licence Agreement, which secures your College accommodation, you will receive an allocated arrival slot. We ask that you arrive during your allocated time in order to avoid difficulties with traffic flow around the city and College site.

International students may need to arrive in Durham before 25 September and accommodation in College for international students will be available from 22 September. Exceptions to this are students who are required to quarantine in College upon arrival. If you are required to quarantine in College upon arrival, your room will be available from 12 September but it is vital that you inform us of your arrival date via email to <u>vm.ug.newstudent@durham.ac.uk</u>.

Opportunities and Support

Your wellbeing is very important to us. We seek to provide all of our students with appropriate opportunities and support in order that they reach their full potential during their time with us. Our Student Support Team includes the Student Support Officer, June Alltimes, and Student Support Coordinator, Jillian Turnbull. In addition, Sharon Bagnall, is always on hand to offer support alongside our Student Experience Officer, Liz Ryder, and the Deputy Principal, Dr Victoria Brown.

Your first point of contact for matters relating to your accommodation, allocation or other pre-arrival matters should be via <u>vm.ug.newstudent@durham.ac.uk</u>. Alternatively, if your query specifically relates to your wellbeing, including medical worries or disability support, please do contact June or Jillian via <u>vm.student-support@durham.ac.uk</u>. We are happy to offer you a pre-arrival student support meeting with a member of the team if helpful.

Following the completion of your registration as a Durham University student you will also gain access to Van Mildert College Student Connect where you can book appointments with the Student Support Team (amongst other things). Student Connect is available at <u>vm.studentconnect.durham.ac.uk</u>. We really hope that things run smoothly throughout your University career, but if they don't, please don't be afraid to say so!



Consent Matters

Durham University recognises the significant impact of all experiences of sexual violence and is committed to promoting a culture in which sexual violence is not tolerated and will be addressed. To achieve this, all members of our University have a responsibility for upholding the principles of dignity and respect. Before 15 October (but ideally pre-arrival), all new students are therefore expected to complete the online course, 'Consent Matters; Boundaries, Respect and Positive Intervention', which is available via Oracle Learning. The course must be completed before participation in College-based clubs, societies or committees and you will be sent a direct link to this course in the coming weeks.

During Welcome and Orientation, we will require you to confirm that you have completed this course. Questions about the course should be directed to June or Jillian (<u>vm.student-support@durham.ac.uk</u>) who will be happy to discuss the course with any member of the College community. Where to find help! Safety Support Wellbeing

DURING OFFICE HOURS:

Need an appointment? All appointments with the Student Support Team are booked through our online portal, Student Connect, which can be accessed via vm.studentconnect.durham.ac.uk. We recommend that you save this link to your phone for easy access!

Illness: Report this to BOTH your department and the Student Support Team (vm.student-support@durham.ac.uk) and complete a Self-Certification of Absence Form online via on Student Connect.

Academic issues, struggling with exams or time management: Discuss with your academic advisor or someone in your department in the first instance. If you want to discuss this further or need to request a Concession, you should book a Student Support Meeting with the Student Support Team via Student Connect.

Personal distress or concern for another student: For urgent concerns contact the Student Support Administrator on 0191 33 47154. Alternatively you should email vm.student-support@durham.ac.uk or book an appointment with the Student Support Team via Student Connect. Alternatively you can contact the Counselling Service located in the Palatine Centre via 0191 33 42200.

Peer Support: For less urgent concerns and when you feel it would be helpful to talk to a fellow student about an issue of concern, you can contact the student-led JCR Talk and Support Team in College or the JCR President.

Something not working in your room: Report this at the College Reception.

OUTSIDE OFFICE HOURS:

Illness: For an emergency see below. For non emergencies, contact the NHS - www.nhs.uk or call the NHS Non-emergency number - 111.

Personal distress or concern for another student: For an emergency see below. For urgent hotline support, contact Nightline (number on back of your campus card) or Samaritans on 116 123 (free of charge).

Noise complaints: Call the College Reception on 0191 334 7100. Remember, you can report anonymously.

IN CASE OF EMERGENCY:

If it is truly an emergency and you need police, fire or an ambulance, then dial 999 (9-999 from an internal phone) and clearly explain the emergency.

Inform the on-duty Porter as soon as possible by contacting Reception on 0191 33 47100.

UNSURE IF IT IS AN EMERGENCY:

Contact the on-duty porter and they can advise you how to proceed. Their number is 0191 33 47100.

Enrolling as a Durham University Student

The University will contact you once you have met the conditions of your offer and accepted your place to request that you begin the process of enrolment.

Two emails will be sent to the personal email address you provided on your application -

- One email contains your Computing and Information Services
 (CIS) username
- The other shows you how to derive your password
- The emails will be sent 24 hours apart, from no.reply@durham.ac.uk

ID Verification

Before you can collect your campus card (your student ID), you will need to prove your identity shortly after your arrival in Durham by providing one of the following:

- Current Passport
- Current UK Driving Licence
- Current European Identity card

If you are a UK home student and you do not have either of these forms of identification, we will accept an original Birth Certificate. When you complete your online enrolment please ensure that your name is an exact match to your proof of identity, i.e. your full legal name.

Campus Cards

Student Registration also provides the opportunity to upload a photograph for your Campus Card – this is your University ID card and also allows access to certain buildings such as the University Library. In order to have your campus card available as soon as you arrive in Durham, your photograph needs to be uploaded by *midnight, 2 weeks prior to your start date* and online enrolment needs to be fully completed.

Finance

The payment of University charges is never going to be the high point of your student experience here at Durham, but we hope that this information makes it as pain free as possible. Students are reminded on a number of occasions of what they need to do, but we recommend that you read the smaller text below in full and retain it for future reference. This is information directly from the University's finance team. **You may also wish to share these pages with your parents or bill payer.**

Tuition fees

Students who will begin their studies in September/October 2021 will pay tuition fees identified at https://www.dur.ac.uk/study/ug/finance/.

Students confirm how their tuition fees are to be paid as part of the online registration process. The possible options are as follows:

- (a) You (or a family member) are paying yourself;
- (b) Loan via Student Finance England (Student Loans Company)
- (c) An external sponsor is to pay the University directly
- (d) You have been awarded a Durham University tuition fee scholarship or bursary

Tuition fee invoices are raised individually as and when information becomes available after registration. We aim to have most raised by the end of October. If you are to pay personally your invoice will be emailed to your preferred email address as indicated in Duo (usually your Durham email address).

Accommodation fees

The residence charge for the forthcoming academic year (including Welcome and Orientation) can be found at https://www.durham.ac.uk/colleges-and-student-experience/accommodation-and-catering/costs/undergraduate-residence-charges/. The residence charge covers three terms, along with the Christmas and Easter vacation periods. The charge includes breakfast, lunch and dinner during University term time as well as all utility bills and internet connection in your room. There are no refunds for any meals not taken.

A very small number of students have a sponsor to pay their accommodation charge, but most are to pay personally. The accommodation charge itself will depend on the type of room allocated, and the invoices are created in bulk at the start of term. Please check your Licence Agreement when received for details of costs.

Further details as to payment methods are set out below. The University's preferred payment method is direct debit.

Where people are to pay personally we know that sometimes, unfortunately, there can be financial difficulties. We are always sympathetic where there is a genuine financial problem and **students are advised to keep the University informed of any difficulties as soon as possible,** usually by making contact with the College Finance Office or with the College Student Support Team.

Please note also that we take a "firm but fair" approach to student debtors in order to be consistent to all students. **Students may be charged a £70 late payment fee** if they are late in making payments and have not advised us in advance that there is an unavoidable delay. Students are even excluded from the University for non-payment of tuition fees beyond a reasonable period of time and required to move out of college accommodation for non-

payment of the accommodation charge. We hold the student responsible for co-ordinating payment and liaising with staff even if you are not paying personally.

Who to contact:

If you have any **queries relating to the accommodation charge** you should contact vm.finance@durham.ac.uk. Likewise you should keep the staff informed in writing if you think **you may be unable to pay** your accommodation charge or tuition fees on time or if you suffer delays by your award authority.

More detail...

You will need to complete online registration where you will indicate with respect to tuition fees:

- (a) how much will be paid by you or a family member and whether this will be by direct debit or cheque.
- (b) how much will be paid by a SLC loan (Home and EU Undergraduate students only);
- (c) how much will be paid by another sponsor. This must be a formal sponsoring organisation and not a family member. (Note: We may request you provide written confirmation from the sponsor).
 - Fee settlement by Student Loans Company tuition fee loan (Home Undergraduate students only)

You can choose to settle payment of your contribution to your tuition fees by taking out a loan with SLC. **This is then paid directly to the university and not to you.** The loan will be repayable by you via the tax system when future earnings exceed a certain limit. If you do not take out a loan then the University will not get paid. We will have no choice but to invoice you and may charge an additional administration fee of £70.

• Personal payment during 21/22 for accommodation or tuition

Your accommodation charge and any contribution to your tuition fees that you elect to pay whilst studying, may be paid in full at the start of the academic year or in three instalments one at the start of each term.

If you pay by direct debit you are given longer to pay as the collection dates are extended to 1st December, 1st February and 1st June or the next working day. Notification letters are sent in advance in the middle of November, January and May advising of the amount to be collected. Once the direct debit mandate is set up it can then be actioned each year thereafter.

You need to have a UK bank account in order to set up a direct debit mandate. Overseas students will find that most UK banks offer a simple account that can pay direct debits. Please note direct debit is not available on savings accounts. Because the first instalment by direct debit is not due until beginning of December you have until 15th November to set up the account and register the details with us. Please let us know if you have problems.

Once you have the appropriate UK bank account you can set up a direct debit in any of the following ways:

- Online <u>http://www.dur.ac.uk/direct.debits/</u>. You will need the student ID number and date of birth to access this secure web page.
- On paper please request a paper mandate form from <u>studentbilling.query@durham.ac.uk</u>
- If you would like someone to telephone you to help you through the screens please email this request to <u>studentbilling.query@durham.ac.uk</u>

Other payment methods

If you do not pay by direct debit the due dates for payment are 30, 14 and 14 days into each term respectively i.e. 3 November 2021, 24 January 2022 and 9 May 2022 for October starters.

These dates are adhered to strictly and a late payment charge of £70 may be raised to you for both tuition and accommodation if you do not pay on time.

Other payment methods are:

(a) International Bank Transfer or International Card for Overseas Students - Flywire

We realise that not all overseas students can set up a UK bank account to operate direct debits and we have an additional method for transferring funds from an overseas bank account which enable you to:

- Visit <u>dur.flywire.com</u> and choose your country and the amounts you are paying in GBP
- Choose your payment method and make your payment to Flywire
- Enter your details and those of the student you are paying for

• Track and confirm your payment by email, SMS or by logging into dur.flywire.com (www.flywire.com)

• Pay in over 150 currencies

• Pay by bank transfer or international credit / debit card. (Alipay and Wechatpay are both available)

- Eliminate bank fees and enjoy good exchange rates
- Track your payment from start to finish
- Pay from any country and any bank
- Feel safe, with 24/7 dedicated multilingual customer support

(b) Payment by cheque on a UK bank account; or banker's draft:

Your cheque or banker's draft should be made payable to "Durham University" and you should write your full name and the invoice/transaction number on the back. Payment should be sent to Finance Department, Mountjoy Centre, Stockton Road, Durham DH1 3LE.

(c) By wire transfer or internet banking into the University's bank account:

(d) By debit / credit card (Switch, Visa or MasterCard):

Either: If you need to pay by card then we would prefer that you set up an instalment arrangement. In this way you provide your credit card details to a secure fax number. These are entered into a third party's web site and payment is set up to take place on the due dates. The card details are then destroyed securely. An email reminder is sent to you automatically before each due date.

This is more efficient for us than processing each payment individually. If you would like to do this please email <u>credit.control@durham.ac.uk</u> to obtain a copy of the form.

Or: If you wish to pay the full amount for the year by card, or do not wish to set up an instalment arrangement, then we have a new method for taking card payments. Simply email <u>finance.cashiers@durham.ac.uk</u> with your student ID number saying how much you wish to pay. The staff will part complete a web form and send a link to you for you to enter the card details. The advantages to this method are:

- You do not have to provide your card details to a member of staff
- The external web page is secure
- You will receive a receipt to confirm payment has been accepted
- There will be no need to refer the high value payment request to the bank

Further Information

1. Change of choice about SLC loan

If you take out a SLC loan to pay your tuition fees, but later change your mind (or vice versa) you are permitted to change your payment method. To do so you need to contact vm.finance@durham.ac.uk.

2. Tuition fees when spending year abroad or on industrial placement

Tuition fees are payable to Durham University by students spending a year abroad on exchange or a year on industrial placement. The year abroad fee is 15% of the normal full year tuition fee. The industrial placement year fee is 20% of the normal full year tuition fee. The year abroad and industrial placement fees are set by the government.

3. Policy for refunds following withdrawal

We hope that you will enjoy your first year at the University and carry on to complete your course with success. However, if you do need to withdraw from your course, remember that you will still need to pay part of your tuition fees and / or accommodation charge as follows:

Tuition fees

The University has a policy for handling withdrawals and the subsequent refund of tuition fees, which falls in line with national guidelines. If you withdraw formally before 1st December in your first year of study you will receive a full refund of all amounts paid to date for tuition fees. If you withdraw on or after 1st December in your first year, you will be liable for one third of the annual charge for each term started. Any outstanding balance will be pursued. The policy will be applied sensitively in cases of illness. Formal withdrawal must be made in writing to your Head of College.

Accommodation charge

If you voluntarily decide to leave college accommodation your licence fee agreement refers to an early termination fee. You have to pay the lower of the balance remaining or 40% of the annual charge.

4. Durham Grant

If you are in receipt of a Durham Grant this will be paid into your bank account even if you are living in College accommodation. We strongly recommend that you use your Durham Grant to pay your College accommodation.

You will not be paid unless you provide the University with your bank sort code and account **number.** Shortly after you are informed about your Durham Grant the Student Financial Support Office will send you an e-mail telling you how to do this.

You will only receive your payments if you are a fully registered student of Durham University on the payment date. You will stop being a fully registered student if you suspend your studies or if you withdraw from your studies.

Van Mildert College welcomes applications from first year undergraduate students for a series of Student Experience Bursaries which carry a value of £1,000 each. The provision of these bursaries is possible due to the generous support of a Van Mildert College alumna with the specific purpose of supporting students who may not otherwise be able to fully participate in, and benefit from, the many opportunities available to them through Van Mildert College and it's common rooms. The bursaries should support activities which develop a Mildertian's intellectual curiosity, personal effectiveness and sense of belonging and responsibility. Recipients are therefore also expected to complete the Durham Inspired Award during the course of their studies.

Eligibility Criteria

In order to fulfil the above objectives, the Van Mildert College Student Experience Bursaries are open to applicants who have attended a state-funded, non-fee paying, school or college for the duration of their education to date and who are the first generation of their family to attend University. Furthermore, while not essential, we welcome applications from students who come from a neighbourhood or community with a low rate of progression to Higher Education or a level of socioeconomic deprivation* along with those born and raised within County Durham or the wider North East of England. How to apply - Applicants must submit a proposal of no more than one A4 page outlining how they intend to become involved in the wider student experience at Van Mildert College along with details of their financial need and/or alignment with the criteria above. The proposal should be accompanied by a CV. All documentation should be submitted via email to vm.ug.newstudent@durham.ac.uk and will be treated sensitively and shared only with the awarding panel.

Van Mildert College offers a number of optional charges to all new students. Please read the below carefully to ensure that the correct charges are applied to you. Two key optional charges are available, these are –

- Provision of a Bedding Pack £35
- Life membership of the Van Mildert Association £20

Bedding Pack

A bedding pack contains the following: one single duvet, one single duvet cover, one pillow, one pillowcase, one single fitted sheet. A bedding pack costs £35.

Please note that students are responsible for the regular laundering of their own bedding. You can purchase a bedding pack <u>here</u>.

Life Membership of the Van Mildert Association (VMA)

Payment of this one-off charge of £20 offers lifetime membership of the Van Mildert Association; the alumni association of Van Mildert College. The association offers current students access to a network of alumni who provide careers mentorship and support engagement with College life through the provision of vital scholarships and bursaries. Alongside this the association organises reunion events for current and former students throughout the year across the UK and overseas. It has a membership of many thousands of former students, many of whom remain in contact with the College long after graduation.

The VMA is an independent organisation to which membership fees will be transferred. We hope that you will make the most of the opportunities available to you through VMA membership by opting into this optional charge in September. You can pay for VMA membership <u>here</u>.

Membership of the Junior Common Room

The Junior Common Room, or JCR, is made up of the undergraduate student body. The vast majority of undergraduates at Van Mildert opt in to JCR membership as it enables you to fully participate in JCR life and receive the many benefits which are at the heart of University life at Durham. If you have any questions about JCR membership, please don't hesitate to get in touch with JCR President, Lucy Egan (vm.president@durham.ac.uk).

Here is an overview of what comes with JCR membership:

- Access to our many sports clubs and societies (and the platform to start your own if you want to).

- Access to our thriving music and drama scene including the ability to take part in performances, shows etc.

Access to all of our facilities from music rooms to table tennis tables
Ability to vote in JCR elections and run for election yourself.

- Capacity to join our outreach projects and other committees e.g. plan our biggest event as part of Ball Committee, or decide where JCR money is spent as part of Treasury Committee.

- Access to every JCR event (ticket prices are often subsidised by the JCR).

You don't need to anything just yet about your JCR membership; an email with more information about the JCR and payment of your membership fee will follow soon. You may also wish to pay for gym membership at Van Mildert College; again, more information will follow.

International Student Letter Requests

International students often require letters of introduction as follows:

 <u>Bank Letter</u> - If you are opening your first UK bank account you may need a bank letter from the University to confirm your student status. However, please await further information from the University about registering for a bank account as new processes may well be in place this year.

We cannot provide any bank letters until you have completed your enrolment and ID verification and are therefore a fully registered student. Letters will therefore not be available until after you have arrived in Durham.

2. <u>Police Registration Letter</u> – Should you require this letter please email <u>vm.ug.newstudent@durham.ac.uk</u>.

Appointments with the Police are usually available shortly after your arrival in Durham but in light of current circumstances we are awaiting further details about how this process will work in 2021. We appreciate your patience. The University will send you more information about Police Registration closer to your arrival.

3. <u>Confirmation of your student status or attendance at Durham</u> <u>University</u> – This letter is available online upon completion of your registration and enrolment. More details from the University will follow via email.

Medical Registration and Vaccination

Registration with a Doctor in Durham

One of your top priorities is to register with doctors at a local medical practice so that you can access healthcare in Durham when you need it. This is especially important if you have an ongoing health condition or require repeat medication and for support with vaccinations and health measures related to Covid-19.

Your choice of medical practice will be determined by the area in which you live. The practice area of the Claypath and University Medical Group covers the University and the Colleges, and the majority of our students register with this practice:

All new students can register with the Claypath and University Medical Group at <u>www.campusdoctor.co.uk/durham</u> via a quick and easy to complete online form. The form uses drop down lists for student accommodation with the Colleges or private providers; if you have other accommodation, please enter your address in Durham. The form also asks whether you have an NHS number or not. You will only have a number if you have previously registered with a doctor in the UK, but you can still complete this online registration if you are an overseas student and don't already have an NHS number.

Registering early ensures that your new medical practice knows about you, can set you up on their systems and be aware of any current medical issues. It also means that any UK NHS notes get transferred early to the practice so they have a full knowledge of your medical history, will be able to take over the prescribing of any medication and understand any further immunisations you might need.

There are other medical practices in Durham that you may want to consider. A full list with locations can be found at: https://countydurhamccg.nhs.uk/about-us/primary-care-memberpractices/. Registration with practices other than the Claypath and University Medical Group is not available online.

Starting at Durham can be a busy and exciting time so, if you have a long-term medical condition and require medication, we recommend bringing sufficient medicines to last for the first couple of months of your time here.

Covid-19 (including Vaccination)

The coronavirus (Covid-19) vaccines are safe and effective, they give you and others the best protection against Covid-19. We encourage all students to book their Covid-19 vaccinations as soon as possible.

UK Students

The UK Government vaccination programme offered all adults the first dose of a Covid-19 vaccination by the end of July 2021. Students who live in the UK are encouraged to have both doses of the Covid-19 vaccination before coming to Durham to start their studies.

If you have not been able to receive a second Covid-19 vaccination prior to arriving at the University, it is essential that you contact the medical practice that you have registered with in Durham to arrange this vaccination as we envision a high demand.

International Students

What you must do when you arrive in England from abroad depends on where you have been in the 10 days before you arrive, and whether you are fully vaccinated.

Once living in the UK and registered with a doctor at a medical centre, international students will be able to access the Covid-19 vaccination free of charge.

Other Vaccinations

Before coming to University we also recommend you ensure that your vaccinations for other infections are up to date. Please consult your current doctor to check if you have had the vaccines below and, if you have not, arrange to receive them **before** coming to Durham.

If you are unable to receive any of these vaccinations before you arrive in Durham, you should make an early appointment with your chosen medical practice on arrival.

Meningitis (MenACWY)

It is particularly important that all students have had a vaccination to prevent meningitis. The MenACWY vaccine is highly effective in preventing illness caused by the four meningococcal strains, including the Men W strain.

Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR)

In recent years there has been an increase in cases of measles and mumps in students at universities. We advise you to consult with your current doctor to check that you have had the necessary two doses of the combined MMR (measles, mumps and rubella) vaccination and receive any MMR vaccinations required before you come to Durham.
