


What is our teaching philosophy?

Teaching Methods



Module and course timetables vary weekly. Contact time depends on module activities and content.

1-2 hours per module, 4-8 weeks per term. Overview of learning objectives Lectures Introduction to key concepts 1-4 hours per module, 3-5 weeks per term. Seminars. Small and large group discussion Workshops, Real-world scenarios **Tutorials** Deep engagement with readings, lectures 2 hr per module, 2-5 weeks per term. Hands-on learning activities **Practical** Sessions Practice using research methods Work with different kinds of data 1:1 dissertation supervision Guided Preparatory readings & tasks for each module Independent Study Guided research for assignments
