The French system is organized in three levels (following the Bologne protocol for EU):

- Licence (3 years / 6 semesters) equivalent BA/BSc
- Master (2 years / 4 semesters) equivalent MA/MSc
- Doctorat (typically 4 years), equivalent PHD.



AN INTERNATIONALIZED STUDENT BODY

Les étudiants étrangers

dans les établissements de l'enseignement supérieur français

En 2021-2022, 13 % des étudiants en France sont étrangers. Sur un total de 392 630, près des deux tiers (65 %) sont inscrits à l'université. Viennent ensuite les écoles de commerce, dans lesquelles sont inscrits 14 % des étudiants étrangers, puis les écoles d'ingénieurs (7 %). Le nombre d'étudiants étrangers a augmenté en moyenne de 21 % en cinq ans.



REGISTER ON ETUDES EN FRANCE

1. ETUDES EN FRANCE PLATFORM





If you are accepted in your higher education programme through a specific application processs, you can start your registration on Etudes
en France:

- Register under «Students already accepted »
- Fill in your application form with your acceptance letter from your French higher education programme

Within a week your application is reviewed!

2. VISA PROCEDURE

Once you have your confirmation from Etudes en France you can start you visa application on the France Visas platform:

- Select the <u>« Student visas »</u>
- Fill in your application form and book your appointment at the TLS Contact Center
- Come to <u>TLS Contact</u> center with the requested documents and your Etudes en France confirmation,

You can apply on France-Visas from 3 months to 3 weeks before the start of the curriculum

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HOW TO FIND AN ACCOMMODATION

France offers a wide range of accommodation solutions for students:

- → Rooms in university residences (CROUS : https://trouverunlogement.lescrous.fr/)
- → Private student residences
- → Private landlords
- → Shared student accommodation
- → Intergenerational housing

Good to know: Some universities and schools have agreements with the CROUS. For more information, contact the school's international relations department. Foreign students are entitled to the same housing benefits as French students







HEALTH: PREPARE TO HAVE A EHIC OR GHIC CARD

1. CHOOSE WHICH CARD SUITS YOUR SITUATION

European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) / Global Health Insurance Card (GHIC)

- If you still have a EHIC card you can use it in France.
- You can now apply for a UK Global Health Insurance Card (GHIC) instead but please be mindful of the delays!
- If you use your EHIC/GHIC you won't be able to get refunded while in France. You will have to keep all of your prescriptions and health invoices.
- You should also have travel insurance and private complementary healthcare cover.

2. BEFORE YOUR DEPARTURE

Assurance maladie: Etudiantetranger.ameli.fr

- Assurance maladie is free and mandatory
- You should also have travel insurance and private complementary healthcare cover.

Gather the documents to register to free health care <u>«Assurance Maladie»</u> This is one of the first things you need to do once you arrive.

→ To increase the amount of refund, students can take a complementary health insurance (mutuelle)

Enjoy the benefits of being a student in France! → Being a student in France means having access to a lot of benefits as well as to a lot of discounts and offers.



Sports and cultural activities → Lower rates and discounts are available for students in museums, cinemas and many other cultural activities



Transports → your visa gives you access to the entire Schengen area. Public transportation is affordable and reliable. Railroad network is affordable and developed









COST OF LIFE – SOME EXAMPLES

Please note that the prices below are given on an indicative basis and are subject to change

Housing

- €650 / month in Paris
- €450 / month in province



Leisure

- €5-9 for 1 cinema ticket*
- €5-15 for 1 museum ticket*
- From €10 for 1 theatre ticket*



*You will often have access to discounts and special rates on presentation of your student card if you are under 26 years old

Transport



- €84,10 for a monthly transport pass in Paris
- €20-35 in province
- €49 for the SNCF Jeune Card for the 12-27 years old

Groceries

- €200 250 / month in Paris
- €150 200 / month in province Some examples :
- ~ €1 for a baguette or a croissant
- ~ €1,20 for 1kg of pasta
- ~ €0,95 for 1L of milk


