Your data

We ask you not to share your (or someone else's) personal information on the platform. We will not ask you to share any personal information whilst you participate in our online event, information such as your home address, date of birth, contact numbers (mobile and home), or any other information which is personal to you. Our Expectations

We want all attendees to be able to access and visit our online events without fear of harassment. Harassment can take many forms, in respect of our online events this can be actions such as (but not restricted to):



Sustained disruption in chatrooms



Unsolicited advertising



Deliberate intimidation

This type of behaviour is considered inappropriate. Anyone deemed to be demonstrating inappropriate behaviour will be in breach of the code of conduct.

What you can expect from us

Any attendee who breaches this code of conduct, whether deliberate or accidental will be removed from the event and their login credentials blocked in order for us to protect our attendees and ensure a safe online visit environment.
