

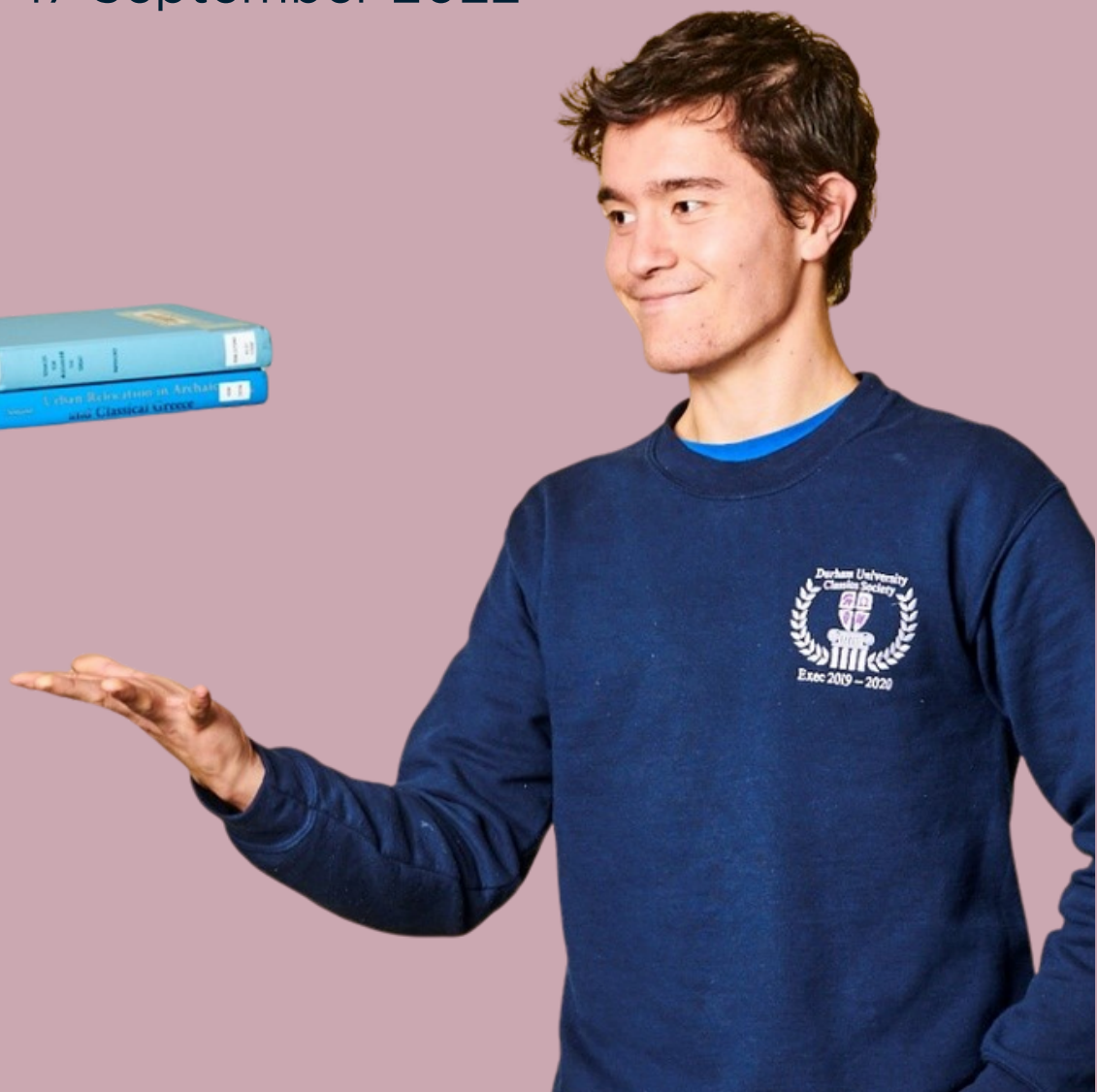

Do I need to book?

YES booking is essential.

You may need a booking confirmation to gain entry into some sessions and drop-ins on the day. Sessions are offered on a first-come, first-served basis, and we hope you understand that prospective students will be given priority over other guests. Please be aware that guest spaces, where available, are limited to two per prospective student

For room and session delivery details use the Academic Session schedules (pages 19, 20 and 21).

For information and advice on getting to and travelling around the university on the day please read our Travel Information (pages 06, 07, 22, 23 and 24).

Join us for our Virtual Open Day Preparation session where we will help you to plan your visit. The session takes place the Wednesday before the events, so pop a note in your diary. We'll send a link to join nearer to the session date.

Top Tip



Book early to avoid disappointment. The booking system will close at 12:00 noon on the Thursday before the event or when bookings reach 10,000.

Undergraduate Event Bursary

Help with travel and accommodation costs

An Event Bursary is available to assist with the cost of travel and accommodation for an applicant to attend an Undergraduate Recruitment Event. A maximum of £200 per applicant can be claimed per Undergraduate Recruitment Event.

Are you eligible?

In order to claim you will need to provide the following evidence prior to the event.

Evidence that shows you are in receipt of government-funded and income-assessed financial support from your college or sixth form such as a 16-19 bursary or free school meals.

AND

Evidence that shows you are a student at a state-maintained school/college*.

or

Evidence that shows you are care experienced and/or estranged (CEES)

or

Evidence that shows you are studying at an independent school and in receipt of a full scholarship awarded on the grounds of financial hardship.

or

Have successfully completed one of the following Access and Participation schemes with Durham University.

- STEP
- Sutton Trust Summer School
- Supported Progression

How do I claim and find out more?

Sign up to attend an event. Your confirmation email will contain a link to the Event Bursary Information and the claim form. You must submit the claim form and upload evidence of eligibility prior to the event.

We will then let you know if your claim has been approved, if it has you will need to pop along to the Event Bursary Claim Desk (location will be in the 'Claim Approved' email) on the day to validate your claim.

You must register at the Event Bursary Claim Desk on the day to confirm your attendance at the event and validate your claim. Failure to do so will unfortunately result in your bursary not being paid.

All payments will be made after the event that has been attended. This process can take up to 8 weeks.



Travelling to the University

We strongly encourage all visitors to use public transport. Parking in Durham city and at nearby Park and Ride car parks is limited and we are unable to provide University parking unless you have access needs.



Visitors with access needs

Please let us know when you book if you or someone in your party has an access need so that we can help support you during your visit. Whether you need access to specific facilities or require to be seated at the front of a lecture theatre we are here to help. The easiest way to do this is by ensuring you complete the Additional Needs information during the booking process. If you did not complete this, please contact us durham.ac.uk/study/ask-us to inform us of any access requirements.

By Rail

Durham is well served by rail links from major cities across the country. The East Coast mainline service from London King's Cross can take less than 3 hours and express links operate from Manchester, Sheffield and Leeds with cross-country links from Scotland, the Midlands, and the South West. Durham Railway Station is approximately 0.6 miles from Palace Green and the Cathedral, and 1.5 miles from the Mountjoy site ⁶⁰. The number 40 Cathedral bus service runs regularly from the train station into the city centre.

To check the schedule and route visit durham.gov.uk and search for "Cathedral bus".

A free University Shuttle Bus will run from the train station to the Lower Mountjoy site throughout the day (08:30-16:30). See pages 24 and 25.

By Coach

There are several express coach services daily from most major cities. The number 6, X12, 56 and 57 all stop near the Lower Mountjoy site. See arrivabus.co.uk for timetable details.



By Air

Durham is 26 miles from Newcastle Airport and 24.3 miles from Durham Tees Valley Airport. Both have regular domestic and international flights. Newcastle Airport is linked to Durham City by rail services. Durham Tees Valley Airport is 6 miles from Darlington railway station, which has regular connections to Durham.



By Road

Durham City centre is two miles from the A1(M). Leave the motorway at Junction 62 on the A690 Durham - Sunderland road and follow signs to Durham City centre. Please check your route for roadworks, which may cause delays. We strongly recommend using the Park & Ride facilities highlighted on the following page.

Top tip
Struggling to find accommodation in Durham? Why not stay in Newcastle or Darlington? Regular trains take less than 20 minutes, and we provide a free shuttle bus from Durham Train Station to the University!

On the day parking...



10,000 visitors are expected at each Open Day. Using public transport, or Park and Ride facilities will make your day easier.

Public Parking

We strongly advise visitors to use public transport to travel to Durham. At each of our Open Days, we expect more than 10,000 visitors. Should you choose to drive you are advised to arrive early (before 9:00).

Public car parks within walking distance of the city centre are:

- The Gates (DH1 4SJ) – 470 spaces
- Prince Bishop’s Shopping Centre (DH1 3UJ) – 400 spaces
- Sidegate (DH1 5SY) – 107 spaces
- The Sands, Multi-storey (DH1 1SL) – 277 spaces

Please note there is a parking charge to use these car parks. The road running through the Market Place to the Cathedral is subject to a £2.00 congestion charge which must be paid in advance or by 18:00 on the charging day. Please call 0191 384 6633 to make payment by credit or debit card.

! Not all Park and Ride facilities have been listed due to their limited capacity. Park and Ride sites are operated by Durham County Council.

Park and Ride

Public transport runs from the Park and Ride car parks into Durham city. One ticket must be purchased for each passenger (£2.00 per person) when using these facilities, you must use the bus provided. Park and stride is not permitted.

Park and Ride sites close at 19:00 and vehicles will be locked in overnight if still on-site at this time. We recommend arriving at the Park and Ride a minimum of one hour prior to your first session as roads may be congested.

Buses run every 15 minutes, Monday to Saturday.

- The bus leaves Belmont Park and Ride at 00, 15, 30 and 45 minutes past the hour. The first bus is at 7.00 am and the last bus is at 6.30 pm.
- The bus leaves Sniperley Park and Ride at 10, 25, 40 and 55 minutes past the hour. The first bus is at 7.10 am and the last bus is at 6.35 pm.

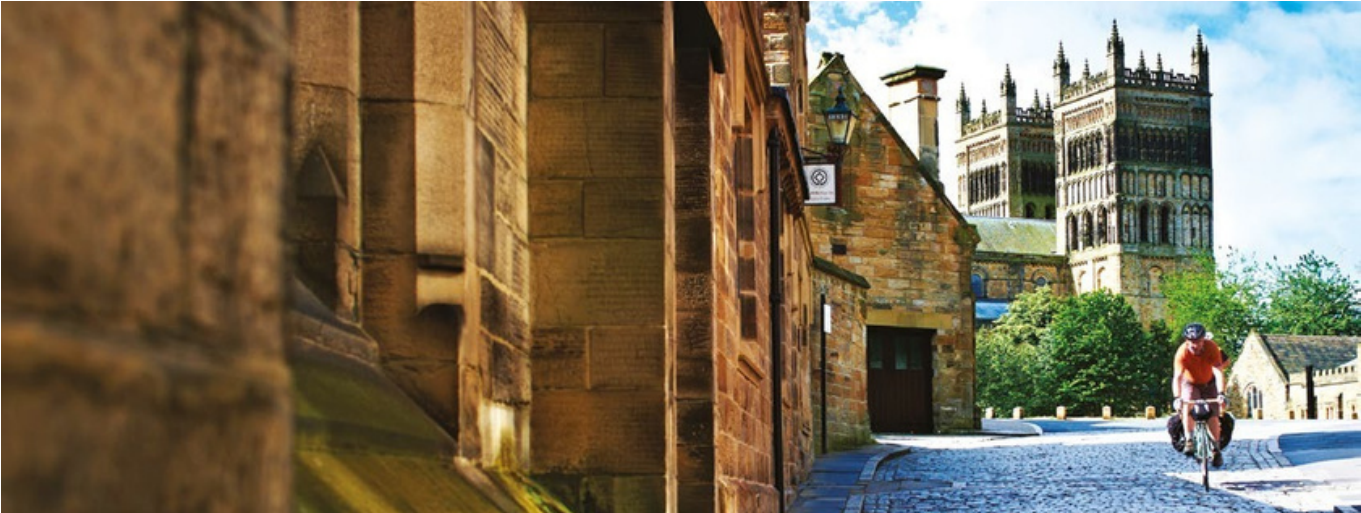

Durham has a range of accommodation available both in the city and across the county.



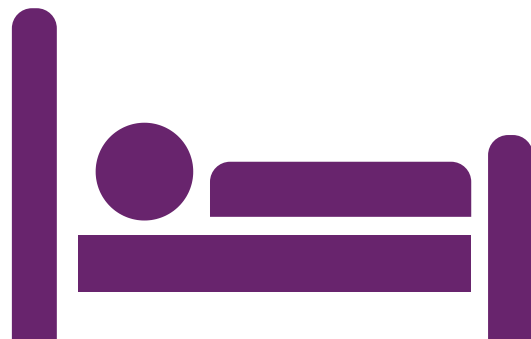

If you prefer to grab and go, a packed lunch is available to pre-order for just £3.95 (sandwich, drink and fruit, crisps or chocolate).

Packed lunches can be booked using the link in your booking confirmation email.

Simply collect from one of our outlets, see 'on the day refreshments' for collection points.



Top tip (this is such a good tip we are telling you it twice)!

If you are travelling by car why not stay in Newcastle (north of the city) or Darlington (south of the city) and use the train on the last leg of your journey, which takes less than 20 minutes! (We provide a free shuttle bus from Durham train station).

Plan your visit in 3 easy steps...


Durham University is spread throughout Durham City. Planning your day before you arrive will really help reduce your step count!

Just so you know

We cap our events to 10,000 visitors. Priority for places at all sessions will be given to prospective students, followed by parents, and then other visitors. The booking system will close at 12:00 noon on the Thursday prior to the event, or if the maximum bookings have been reached. We recommend you book early to avoid disappointment as it's very easy to cancel using the link in your confirmation email.



Use the maps provided and/or google maps to navigate Durham. Durham is a walkable city and the majority (but not all) of the Open Day activities are scheduled close together.



Plan how you are going to get to Durham and where you are going to park. We strongly recommend using public transport.

Step 1

Plan what you want to see and what you want to find out about before you arrive by reading this guide and then looking at the session schedules on pages 19-21.

We recommend you include the following in your visit

- Presentations from the academic department(s) you are interested in
- Tour at least two colleges
- Drop in on any extra-curricular activities you may be interested in
- Visit all relevant Professional Support Services.

Step 2

Once you have decided on your preferred sessions use the Session Schedule and maps (pages 19-25) to locate where each session will be delivered in each of the zones.

It should take no more than 5-10 minutes to move between academic buildings located in the same zone. You will need to allow additional time when moving between colleges or different zones.

Use the 'walking time' table on page 24 to help you plan. We also have University shuttle buses running throughout the Open Day. See pages 24 and 25 for details.



Top tip
Finding your building location is easy, just look at the colour of the circle and find the building in the relevant coloured zone on the map. Ambassadors inside the building will direct you to the room.

Step 3

Book Your Place. You will also need to select how many guests you will be bringing. Please note that guest spaces are limited to two per prospective student. You should receive a confirmation email within a couple of hours. If you don't receive a confirmation email please re-book. Click on the link in the confirmation email to book catering.

Things to do during your visit

This guide provides you with all you need to know to plan a successful Open Day visit.

Priority Access

Sessions are non-bookable to provide the most flexibility for you during your visit. We tend to find those sessions at the beginning and the end of the day have higher availability. With this in mind we give priority access to potential students for all our sessions and we thank you in advance for your co-operation.

Where a session is full, guests of potential students will be asked to vacate their seat.



What type of sessions can I attend?

Presentations

Presentations are offered by all our academic departments. You may find sessions are delivered in venues not ordinarily used by the department, this is to meet the visitor demand and room availability due to refurbishments. We would ask that you don't visit any department buildings other than those listed as delivering presentations or tours on the day. A full listing of all sessions is available on pages 19, 20 and 21.

Tours

Many academic departments and colleges will be running tours of their facilities. You can also tour the Sports and Wellbeing Park.

Drop-in

If you have a specific individual query, our academic staff will be available within advertised drop-in sessions. Additionally, support services will be hosting drop-in sessions throughout the day. You must be booked onto the Open Day to attend the drop-in sessions.

Exhibitions

Some of our departments will offer exhibitions and displays within their department as part of, or in addition to, their presentations. Please see the schedules on pages 19, 20 and 21 for a full list of activities on offer.

Academic departments

Presentations, drop-ins, tours and exhibitions throughout the day will provide you with the opportunity to explore your subject choice.

In addition to presentations, some departments will also be available in the Information Hub located in the Teaching and Learning Centre to answer any questions you may have.

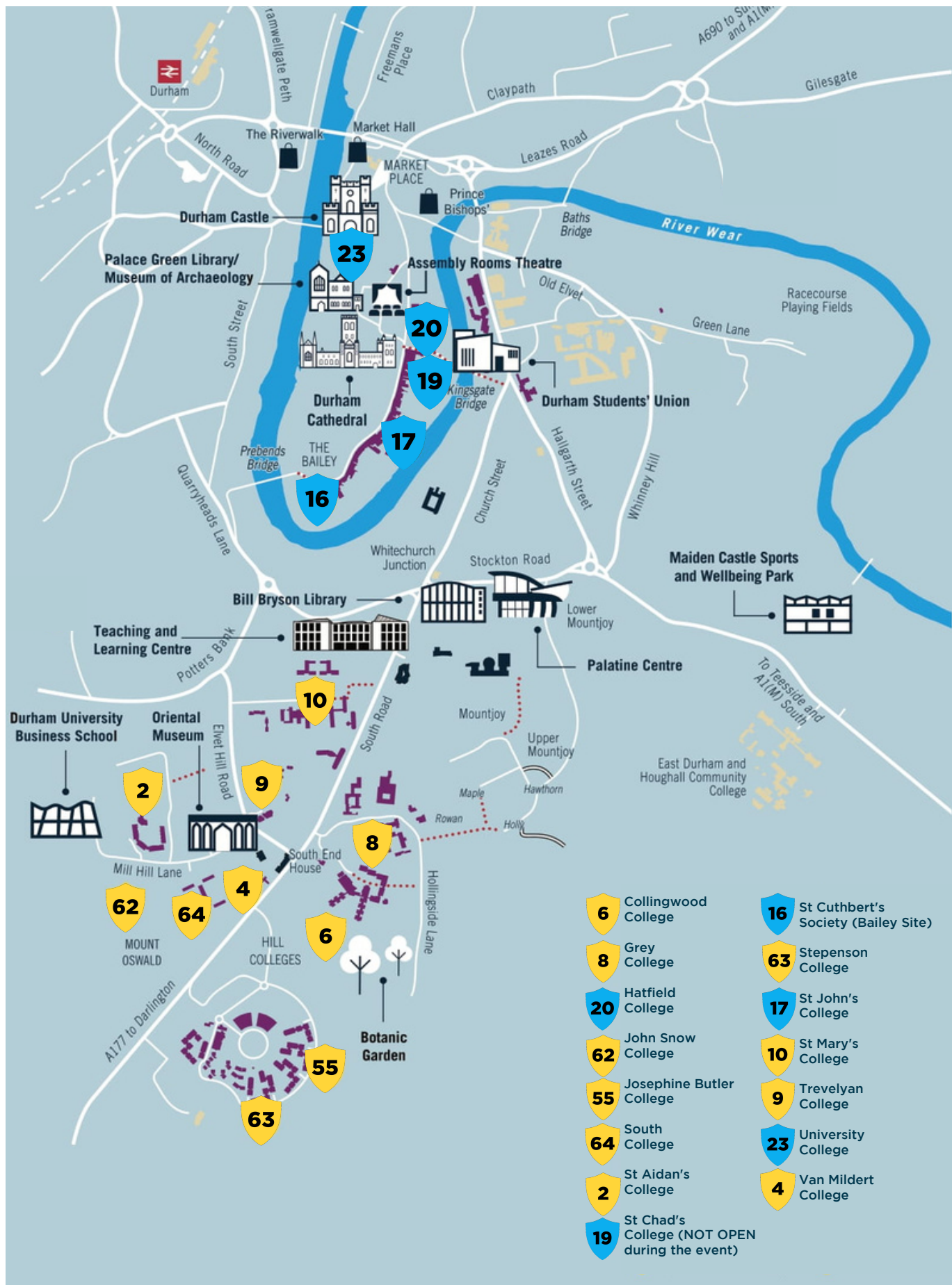

The Durham Difference 24

Introducing you to the University, this session will explain the 'Durham Difference', providing an overview of the University, its values, vision and goals. It will introduce you to our collegiate system and explain what it means for our students to become a member of one of our college communities. The presentation will take place in the Teaching and Learning Centre.

Study Abroad 60 24

Durham University has over 300 student exchange agreements in Europe and around the world. Our partner institutions are spread across the globe from Austria to New Zealand! Almost 300 Durham students every year take the opportunity to study abroad and we welcome over 370 students to Durham from our partner institutions each year. It really is the opportunity of a lifetime and will add something unique to your CV.

Drop into the Information Hub in the Teaching and Learning Centre to speak to a student who has studied abroad to find out more, or alternatively attend the presentation in the Palatine Centre.

Placement Years 15 24

A Placement Year offers you the opportunity to spend a year gaining valuable work experience during your time at Durham University. It is a fantastic opportunity to immerse yourself fully within an organisation, applying the knowledge from your studies in a practical setting. You can choose to do a placement anywhere in the world so long as it is located in a country that is safe to travel to. The majority of departments offer you the option to incorporate a Placement Year into your degree. You do not have to make that decision until you come to Durham however some departments (Business and Science) offer UCAS code programmes with Placement Years embedded. The Placement Year will occur in the penultimate year, extending your degree to either 4 or 5 years.

Careers & Enterprise 60

Careers & Enterprise at university is about having the time of your life whilst studying a subject you enjoy. It's also about gaining a qualification and developing skills and experience that can lead to a fulfilling and rewarding career. Find out how we support students, how we work with employers and the types of opportunities available to students during and after their studies by attending the presentation.

Disability Support 60

Disability Support aims to support students in achieving their academic potential by offering advice and guidance and arranging appropriate provision. They offer support to those who may have a disability, specific learning difference or ongoing medical condition. They offer targeted support to those identifying with an autism spectrum condition. If you feel you may benefit from their advice or support why not pop along to the department based on the ground floor of the Palatine Centre.

Counselling & Mental Health Services 60

The Counselling & Mental Health Service offers specialist support at any time during your studies if you are struggling with academic or personal challenges. It operates as an addition to the support offered in colleges and academic departments. Our teams of professional, accredited counsellors, Psychological Wellbeing Practitioners and Mental Health Advisors help students to manage any difficulties impacting study or wider university life. We offer individual sessions, groups and workshops, and are based on the ground floor of the Palatine Centre.

Durham Students' Union 26

Durham SU was created by students in 1899 to bring students from across the university together. The aim of the Union was to allow students to work collectively, regardless of their college, on issues affecting Durham students. The ethos of bringing students from across the university together continues today and can be seen in the 250+ societies run by students with the support of the Students' Union, elected student officers in representing students' views at all levels of the university, campaigning on topics like getting more space in the Billy B, and associations for particular groups of students like trans students and mature students.

If you need a helping hand while at Durham, the Union's Advice Service is there for you, offering independent support and resources across a variety of issues. There are also relaxing and spacious social and study areas within the bar and café, affording beautiful views from the balcony terrace of the Cathedral and river. Why not pop along? A member of the team will be available to chat about the Union and to answer questions, throughout the day outside the Students' Union building as it finishes getting refurbished.

DU Student Volunteering and Outreach 24

Students have endless opportunities to get involved with volunteering activities both within their colleges and at a wider University level. Last year 2,000 students volunteered 35,000 hours of their time to support our local community! The direction and focus of volunteering at Durham is driven by an elected student executive committee.

DU Student Volunteering and Outreach is the largest volunteering organisation at Durham with over 50 student-led, community-focused projects. We have projects to suit all interests, from tutoring local school children, running tea parties for elderly residents or supporting adults with learning disabilities through conservation work. We also run a range of inclusive sports outreach projects including programmes for hard-to-reach groups. We offer amazing training opportunities for all of our student volunteers as well as the chance to gain accredited qualifications in volunteering and nationally recognised coaching qualifications. The best thing about DU Student Volunteering and Outreach is that it is student-led, so if you don't see a project that you're interested in, you can set up your own!

To round up each year of success, we hold an annual celebration for all of our volunteers at the Durham University Volunteer Awards evening, set in the majestic Town Hall, where we recognise all of our volunteers' achievements and the positive impact they have had on the local community!

Libraries and Study Facilities

The Bill Bryson Library **13**

The largest of the University's libraries and provides access to print resources for all subjects. It has 1800 study spaces including bookable individual and group study rooms, collaborative and quiet study areas as well as a café. Additional study spaces are also available in the Teaching and Learning Centre, Business School Library and Leazes Road Study Centre.

Across all our collections, we provide access to 1.6 million printed books, 25,000 eJournals and over 850,000 eBooks and other digital items. Why not come and explore the library facilities? We have bookable tours of the Bill Bryson Library throughout the day, or you can just pop in and have a look around and talk to our friendly and helpful staff.

In addition to our modern collections, we have two further locations to add to your itinerary- Palace Green Library and Oriental Museum, where you can explore Durham University's world-class collections of art archaeology, archives, rare books and manuscripts, as well as browse their shops!

Palace Green Library (open daily 10:00am - 5:00pm) **18**

Located between the Castle and Cathedral, was once the main University Library. It incorporates buildings dating back to the 15th century and now houses the University's extensive archives and special collections. These can be accessed in the Barker Research Library, which also provides 60 quiet student study spaces. Palace Green Library is home to our Museum of Archaeology, World Heritage Site Visitor Centre and the historic library of Bishop Cosin.

The Oriental Museum (open 10:00am-5:00pm Tuesday-Friday and 12:00pm-5:00pm weekends) **3**

Found just off Mill Hill Lane opposite Van Mildert College. Our museums are home to over 82,000 objects and artworks from 59 countries, including two collections that are recognised as being of national and international importance.

Both Palace Green Library and the Oriental Museum have display galleries that house regular exhibitions, both permanent and changing, so there is always something new to see and do. Entry is free, so you can just come and relax or visit with friends and family. They also host events for families and school groups throughout the year and offer volunteering opportunities for students to get involved, as well as placements as part of career development.

All the items in Palace Green Library and the Oriental Museum support university research and teaching across the faculties, from foundation studies to doctoral level. They can also be used for any private or personal research, even if that is completely unrelated to the course you are studying.

Academic Development for Students and Foundation Programme **24**

We offer a range of educational services for Durham students and staff. Of particular interest to attendees will be 'Academic Development for Students': a suite of courses, classes and consultations in academic study skills (e.g. academic writing; time management; strategies for being productive; etc). Come and chat with us at the Information Hub (located in the Teaching and Learning Centre, top floor) for more details. We can also let you know about the Foundation programme offered at Durham.



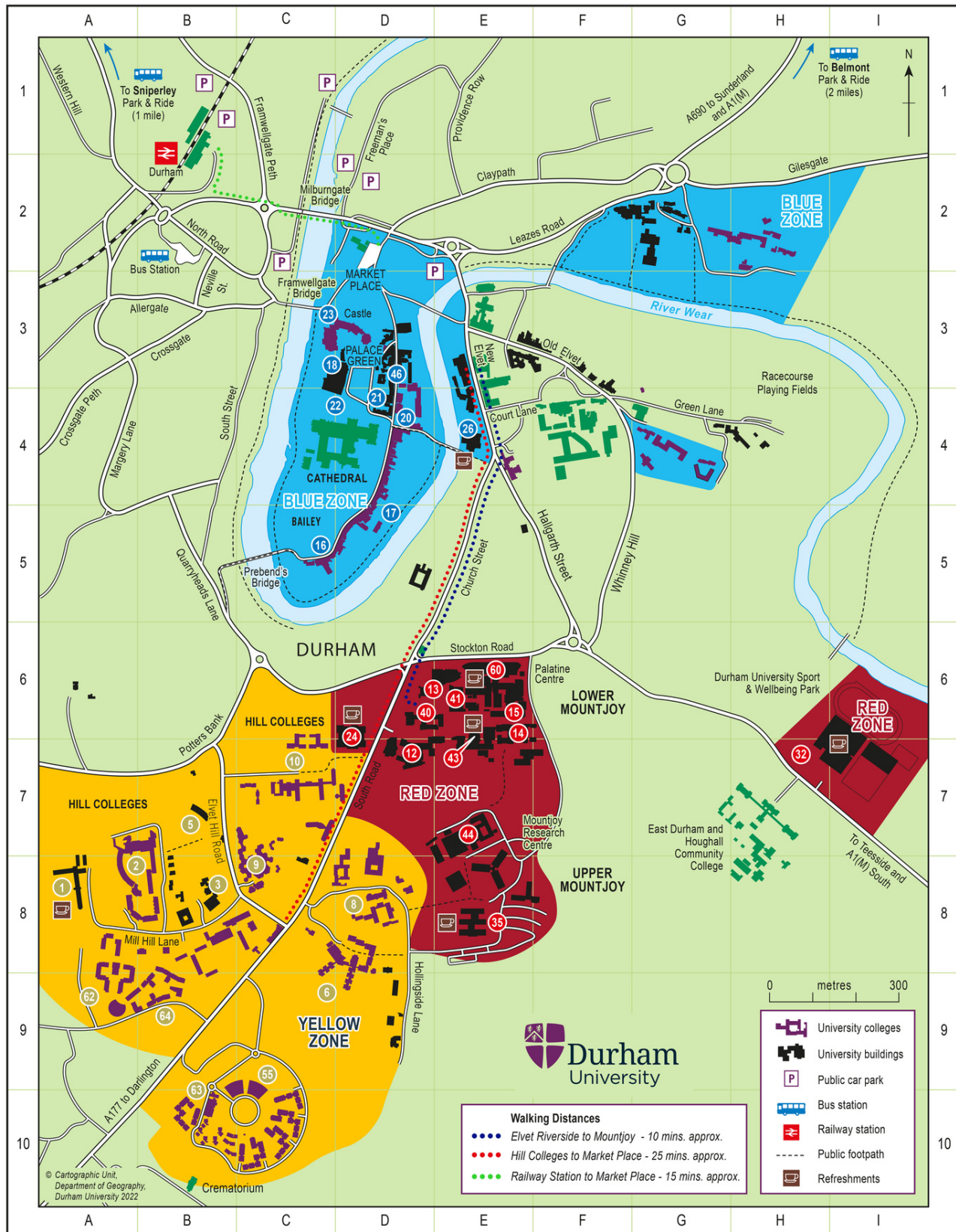

Open day map

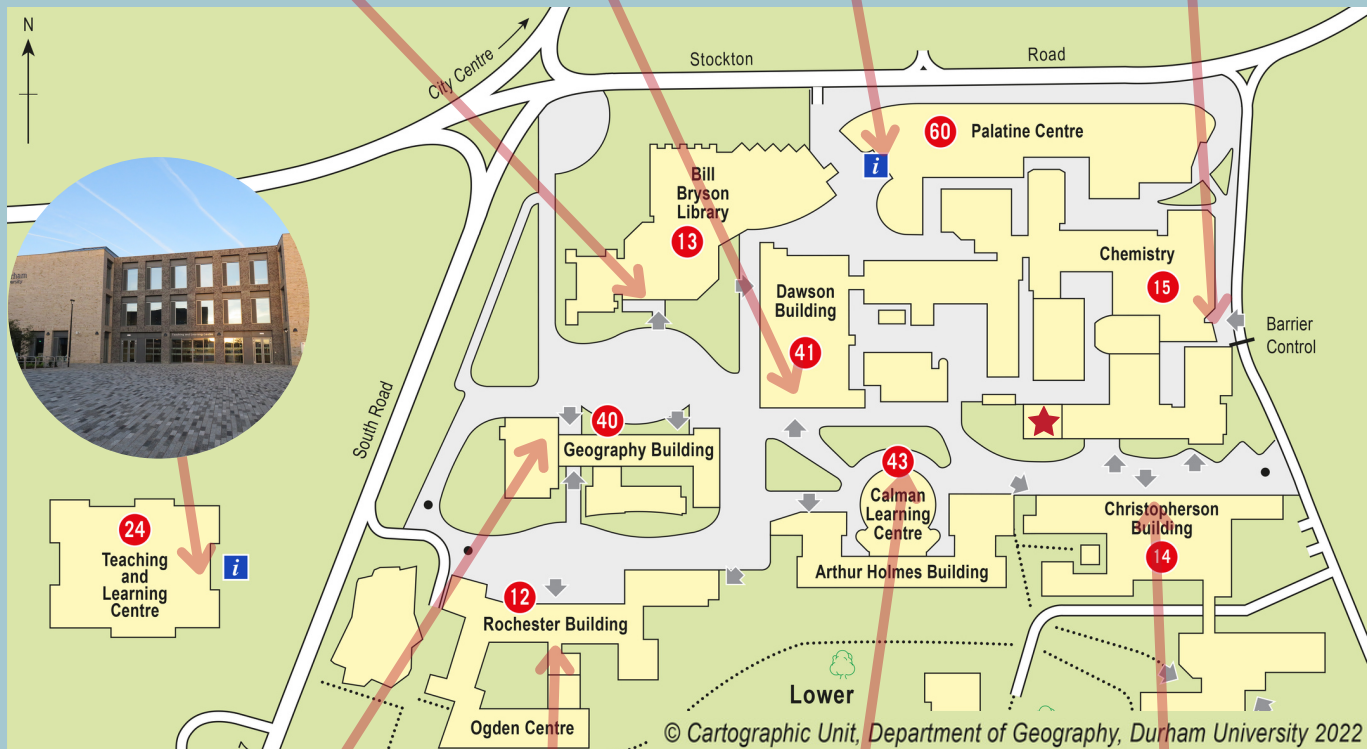

Shuttle Buses




Shuttle buses will operate every 10-15 minutes starting at 08:30 and finishing at 16:30, however due to traffic congestion and roadworks you may have to wait longer than this. Please ensure you board the bus at the bus stop in the direction of travel you wish to go. All of our shuttle buses will have an ambassador on board, so please ask the ambassador for advice on where to get off.

Park and Ride

Public transport runs from the Park and Ride car parks into Durham city. One ticket must be purchased for each passenger (£2.00 per person) when using these facilities, even if the bus is not used. Park and Ride sites close at 19:00 and vehicles will be locked in overnight if still on-site at this time. We recommend arriving at the Park and Ride a minimum of one hour prior to your first session as roads may be congested.




Belmont: DH1 1SR – 547 spaces (get off at the Milburngate Bridge bus stop)

Sniperley: DH1 5RA – 330 spaces (get off at the Claypath bus stop)

Not all Park and Ride facilities have been listed due to their limited capacity. Park and Ride sites are operated by Durham County Council.

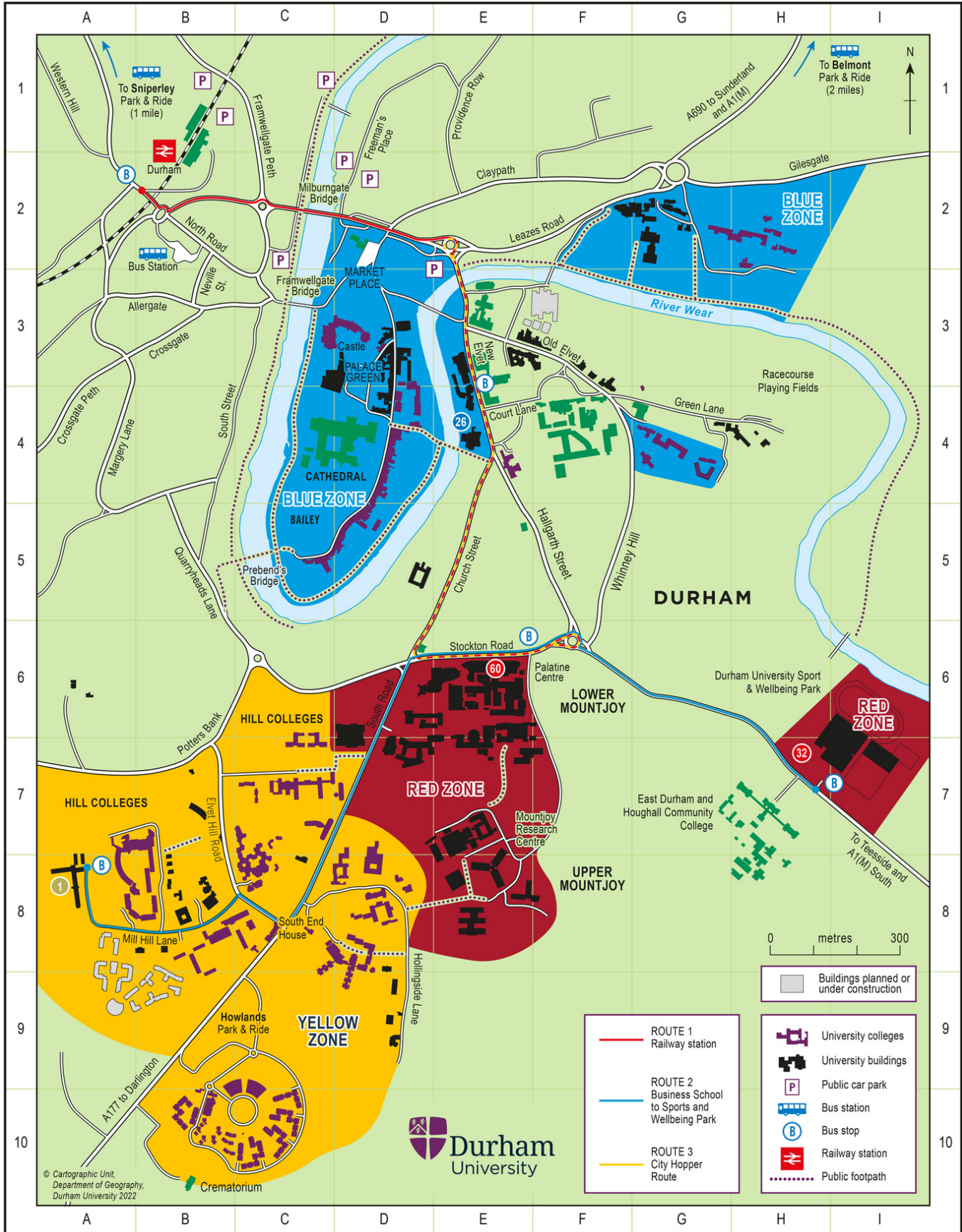
