Teaching & Learning

- Annual intake of c. 30-40 students in Russian, of which 25-30% with Russian A-Level, 70-75% beginners
- Small group language and discussion classes, conversation clubs and round tables with students from partner universities
- Interdisciplinary and transcultural conception of Russian Studies
- Work with a variety of sources, media and texts
- Research-led teaching and learning
- Independent research projects in the final year




